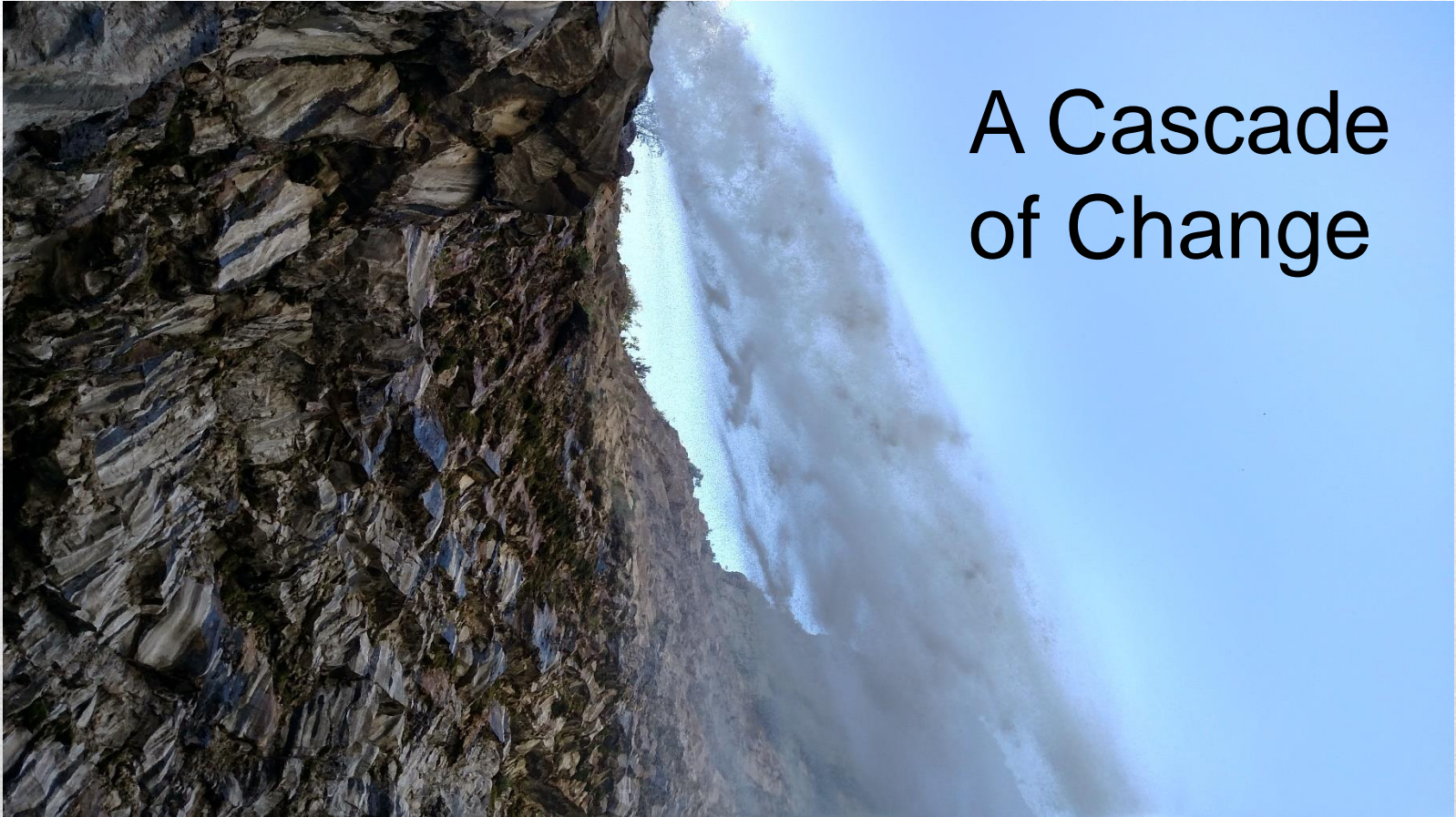

- Open source
- Open data
- Responsive Design

- NuCivic
 - Developed DKAN
 - Acquired by GovDelivery in December 2015
 - Choice of on-premises or SaaS: ND went with on-premises
- GovDelivery
 - SaaS only
 - Procurement hoops completed December 2016
 - Production (SaaS) in February 2017

GIS Hub Data Portal – Change

- Granicus
 - Merged with GovDelivery October 2016
 - Business as usual
- Civic Actions
 - Acquired DKAN June 2017
 - Drupal company
 - Will continue hosted service
 - Wants to be more focused and responsive
 - VP Public Sector – visiting sites

GIS Hub Data Portal – Change

- Expand users and usage
- Push into other areas, spatial and non-spatial
- Possible future – integrate into state’s Drupal
