 - i. Casey No membership updates at this time, Susan has been sending emails

 - i. Patrick he and Eileen have had recent discussion, following up to last Summit, figuring out the Clearinghouse Summit "Summit" at the Symposium.
 - ii. Mark Y asked location of next Summit, Patrick thought outside of St. Louis or Illinois

 - i. Standing call for list of upcoming conferences
 - Website update (Charles) Let him & Shellie know if stuff to add on website,
 "...busier than a squirrel on crack hiding stuff on website from Tony." Updating website can be challenging, e.g., making updates on each page instead of global changes
- d. Symposium (If applicable)
 - Mark Y sending blasts keep them going; Keynotes: Opening keynote Dr. Abdullah from Woolpert; closing keynote Mitchell from Esri will be talking about mountaineering experience. Mini-shops – Wednesday morning – these are variable, can be short, or longer. Will be an arcade/scripting desk, Burt from Illinois; how to become a GISP from Tony. Casey said if we could get more people to volunteer for presentations, that would be great, we need more variety.

 - a. State Coordinator's Reports
 - i. Arkansas (Brian): still not firm if having a spring meeting or not, searching for a location that will be free,
 - ii. Iowa (Patrick): Broadband-related, wrapping up some BAS (consolidated response)
 - iii. Illinois (Mark): Hopefully flights beginning now with good weather, closed retainer search, dealing with indoor mapping – setting up state standard, using Esri and GeoComm and others, don't have \$ for school indoor mapping even though it was pushed through legislation, next fall conference will be in East Peoria, October 20-22, May 20th they have a regional meeting in downtown Chicago

 - vi. North Dakota (Bob): I forgot to mention at last month's meeting that earlier in January we had a nice visit with several BIA folks. Basically, an informal discussion to get SGC members connected with key people with knowledge of tribal-related information and data. A primary focus was authoritative data sources and key contacts for things like roads, parcels, etc. thank you Elaine for helping to set that up, 2nd, had a meeting also helped with key USGS folks that Elaine also helped to set up, to discuss data storage. This was an outgrowth of Elaine's presentation at the Clearinghouse Summit. 3rd, there is an on-going bug with ArcHub sites where if browsing between groups, categories, or tags, the content will appear to be missing. It has been replicated by Esri and is logged as a bug. Workarounds including refreshing the page and switching to classic view.
 - vii. Nebraska (Casey): Every other year council does statewide technology plan. Last 8 years or so the same items, some have completed naturally, some no



longer fit, looking to boil those down, then for internal review with their council and above and then up to Legislature. 3 spots open on council. Continuing to move to the cloud, she recommends using <u>SnapMirror</u> (NetApp) took 2 weeks for 42TB.

- viii. Oklahoma (): Conference coming up and is full, 911 has taken a big chunk of their time including standards, state data sharing meeting yesterday, which includes inventory REST services and listing of additional ones
- ix. South Dakota (Mark): Mostly working on enterprise, recently launched new portal for Game Fish and Parks, DOT set up with R&H, working to stand up Event Server for Highway Patrol. Have launched 11 AGS servers, 3 portals, 954 services over the past year. One bug 10.9 to 11.1 is a bug from July, fixed in October, then the bug fix took out the servers, then a bug in web adaptor.
